2024 Pennsylvania Election Basics

**Primary Election Day
Tuesday, April 23, 2024**

What is the PURPOSE of a Primary?

- Voters from the 2 major parties select their candidates to run in the November General Election

Who CAN VOTE in the PA Primary?

- In Pennsylvania **ONLY Democrats and Republicans** can vote in the Primary to choose their candidates to run in the November General Election.

Who CAN NOT VOTE in the PA Primary?

- Registered Independents and 3rd parties.

Who CAN VOTE in the General Election?

- All Registered Voters

HOW do I register to vote?



- **Scan the QR code**
- **Or** By cell phone or computer at: www.vote.pa.gov
- At the DMV when you apply for a Driver's License or photo ID
- No Driver's License or photo ID? Get a paper form from Voter Services.

How do I CHECK to see if I'm registered?

- Go to: www.vote.pa.gov
- Your registration may have been purged if you have not voted in the last 5 years. **You can register again!**

What are the voter registration DEADLINES?

- **By April 8, 2024** for the Primary
- **By October 21, 2024** for the General



Vote by Mail OR In Person!



How do I vote by mail?

Step 1 – APPLY FOR a Mail-in Ballot

Go to www.vote.pa.gov

- **Deadline to apply** for a Primary ballot is April 16, 2024*
- **Deadline to apply** for a General ballot is October 29, 2024*
- A ballot will be mailed to your home.
**due to delay issues within the USPS it is recommended to apply and return your ballot 10 days before these deadlines.*

Step 2 – Complete and return your Mail-in Ballot

- Use black pen to fill in the oval next to your choices.
- Put ballot into the plain secrecy envelope and seal it. Do not write on this secrecy envelope.
- Put secrecy envelope into the mailing envelope, then SIGN and DATE it where indicated.
- **MAIL BACK RIGHT AWAY** or you must **bring it yourself** to a Ballot DROP BOX (check your County Voter Services for availability and locations).
- **Ballot must be received by 8:00 pm on election day to count.**

Where do I go to vote in person?

- Find your polling place on your voter registration card
- OR**
- Search “Where’s my polling place?” on: www.vote.pa.gov – Polls can change

Do I need an ID?

- **Only if you are a first-time voter**, or if you are voting in a new precinct.
- **Acceptable ID:** driver’s license, US passport, voter registration card, military, student or employee ID, firearm permit, current utility bill or bank statement, paycheck or government check, any ID issued by PA or federal government.

“A Republic, if you can keep it.”
